



Composite Sink Care & Maintenance

Your composite quartz sink is made from premium natural quartz crystals and acrylic resins, creating a durable, long-lasting surface designed for everyday use. With proper care and routine maintenance, your sink will maintain its beauty for years to come.

Daily Cleaning

For everyday residue from washing dishes and regular use:

- Clean the sink with warm water, a non-abrasive cleaner, and a soft cloth or sponge.
- Recommended cleaners include:
 - Liquid dish soap
 - Bar Keepers Friend
 - Soft Scrub
- Rinse thoroughly with hot water.
- Dry the sink after each use to help prevent water spots and soap film buildup.

Drying the sink regularly is especially important for darker-colored sinks.

Removing Metal Marks

Pots, pans, and utensils may leave metal abrasions on the surface.

To remove them:

- Use a rub-out sponge such as a Mr. Clean Magic Eraser sponge.
- Follow up by cleaning the sink with dish soap and water.
- Rinse thoroughly with hot water and dry.

Repeat as needed.

Removing Lime Scale & Calcium Deposits

Hard water can leave calcium buildup or lime scale stains.

Vinegar Method

- Mix equal parts vinegar and water (50/50).

- Apply to affected areas and let sit for approximately 20 minutes.
- Rinse thoroughly with hot water and dry.

Commercial Cleaner Method

You may also use a commercial lime scale remover such as:

- CLR
- Lime Away

Follow the manufacturer's directions carefully, then rinse thoroughly and dry.

A wet Magic Eraser sponge may also help remove stubborn calcium deposits.

Removing Stubborn Stains

For tougher stains:

- Use a mild abrasive cleaner such as Bar Keepers Friend with a soft scouring pad.

WARNING

Bleach solutions should only be used on white composite sinks.

Using bleach on colored sinks may cause discoloration or fading.

For white sinks only:

- Mix 1 part household bleach with at least 1 part water.
- Let soak for up to 1 hour.
- Drain, rinse thoroughly with hot water, and dry completely.

Important Care Guidelines

To protect your sink and maintain its appearance:

- Do not place hot pots or other hot items directly onto the sinks surface. Let them cool completely before placing them on the sinks surface.
- Do not use the sink as a cutting board. While quartz is incredibly durable, sharp knives may cut into the surface.
- Do not clean the sink with abrasive cleaning/scouring pads and powder detergents. This may dull and damage the sink's surface. If needed a nylon brush or soft scouring pad can be used.
- Strong alkalis (ammonia and caustic soda solutions) must be avoided.
- Be very careful with drain cleaners. Do not let any drain cleaner come into contact with the sink's surface.

- The most important regular cleaning tip is to rinse well and dry the sink after every use, particularly with darker colored sinks.

While composite sinks are highly durable and scratch resistant, they are not completely scratch proof.

Quartz Sink Cleaning Oil

A specialized quartz sink cleaning oil can help maintain the appearance of your sink and provide additional surface protection.

Benefits include:

- Enhances shine and overall appearance
- Adds a protective hydrophobic coating
- Helps repel water and reduce buildup
- Assists in maintaining a clean, polished finish

How to Use

1. Thoroughly clean and dry the sink.
2. Apply a small amount of oil to the sink bowl.
3. Wipe evenly across the entire surface with a soft cloth.
4. Apply additional product if needed.

Recommended usage is every 2–3 weeks, depending on sink usage. For best results, we recommend using Karran's Luster Pro Oil that can be bought at Masters Countertops.

Warranty Information

All composite sinks include a limited lifetime warranty covering manufacturing and design defects when used under normal conditions and maintained properly.
